Write notes of encouragement

1. Let's apply this, then talk about it. Let me give each of you a blank card that you can write to someone. Take a minute to write a card. Then share with us who you wrote a card to and why you selected them.
2. Let's memorize Hebrews 10:24 - 25 together.¹
3. Why do we all need encouragement?
4. Why do we need encouragement daily?
5. How many notes of encouragement do you receive in a typical year?
6. Which is better—a card, a phone call, a gift, a text, or an email? Why so?²
7. How did John Wesley's letter encourage William Wilberforce? Who can recall that story?
8. Imagine that you adopted the practice of sending a brief note of encouragement to each of your class members once or twice a year. What might that do to the atmosphere of the group?
9. Besides group members, who else could you write regularly?
10. How often do you send your spouse a card?
11. What keeps you from doing this kind of thing?
12. How could you make the practice of writing notes of encouragement easier?³
13. How do you want to apply this week's lesson?
14. How can we pray for one another?
15. Who can remember Hebrews 10:24 - 25?
